## <u>THE GOLDEN JUBILEE OF THE</u> <u>AUSTIN 7 - LONGBRIDGE AUGUST</u> 1972



50 years ago in the UK, The Golden Jubilee of the Austin Seven was conducted over a 3 day August Bank Holiday Weekend at Longbridge, Birmingham. The event went exceedingly well. There were 415 Sevens,



Ian Dunford was the Rally Co-ordinator I met him 25 years later in Devon on Porlock Hill! ( Editor Tim)

backed up by half-a-dozen Big Sevens and a number of Austin Specials. This was the largest vet gathering of one make, let alone one model ever seen in the UK till then. The large assembly stretched down both sides of a dual carriage way at the old Austin Works. It was estimated that this many cars represented one week's production at the peak of the Seven's production. It was also supposed that for every car present there probably were at least two not present at this remarkable rally, Britain must possess at the very least 1500 survivors of its bestloved car. The very early Chummies drew the onlookers. The Birmingham transport Museum's 1923 example, claimed to be the earliest outside the science Museum, having been first registered in June 1923, but with later modern (for a Seven) conveniences, but D.A.Doughty's 1923 Tourer, being registered in August 1923, was without a fan, a starter and no shock absorbers, and had the metal universal joint, like the very first cars made.

(it makes you think, all those cars are now 50 years old now, than they were then!)

# <u>AUSTIN SEVENS COMPLETE A EPIC 11,000-MILE TRIP THROUGH THE AMERICAS IN 2013</u>

The Nicaraguan police force and mechanical misdemeanors were just two of the challenges faced by a



heroic team of three Austin Sevens as they travelled from Buenos Aires to New York from 20 February to 12 June. Tackling the journey were seasoned Austin enthusiasts Jack Peppiatt and Amanda Peters in their 1933 RP DeLuxe Saloon, River Dukes and Diana Garside in a 1929 Chummy (a wedding present from Diana's mother) and Stan Price in his 1932 RN Saloon. The trio would follow the same route as Austin Seven adventurer John Coleman whose

book, Coleman's Drive, had inspired Peppiatt to plan the expedition.

Peppiatt said: "My uncle gave me an Austin Seven at the age of 16, complete with its rear axle on the back seat. He told me that the car was mine, all I had to do was fit the axle."

Having completed the work and read the book, the plan to tackle Coleman's 1959 route was firmly etched in Peppiatt's mind.

"I would meet Coleman some years later and shared with him my plan to retrace his steps and he wholeheartedly approved," said Peppiatt.

The trip followed the original route of Coleman, who died in 2010, as closely as possible, starting in Argentina and travelling through Chile, Peru, Ecuador and Colombia, before catching a ferry to Panama and on to Costa Rica, Nicaragua, El Salvador, Guatemala, Mexico and, finally, the USA.

"One of the hairiest moments of the trip came after an accident in Nicaragua," added Peppiat. "A threeinch lip from the road to the verge and a sudden gust of wind caused River to come off the road and brush some farm workers.

"The police arrived, and River had to spend the night as a guest of the Nicaraguan constabulary. No one was seriously hurt in the accident, though, and we were soon sent on our way."

Car trouble was also a factor, although maybe not as much as you would have thought on such a gruelling escapade.

"In all we suffered 10 punctures, while Diana's Chummy required a new gearbox," said Peppiatt. One of biggest problems, though, was broken piston rings, which resulted in an engine rebuild and head polish in Lima thanks to local mechanic Javier Garaycochea.

Peppiatt said: "Without Javier we would have been sunk, I think. His contacts and extreme helpfulness saved the day. We have a large vote of thanks to offer him and his workshop staff and contacts – the engine's still running strong 6000 miles later."

Diana's Chummy, Feisty, would require similar work in northern Panama.

The trip has since drummed up international interest, with <u>Peppiatt's blog</u> receiving more than 30,000 reads.

All of the cars (including Coleman's original Seven) will be on show at the <u>National Austin 7 Rally</u> at Beaulieu, Hants on 7 July.

Joining them at Beaulieu will be an Austin Seven that's travelled even further.

### A Classic drive with 'Alfred'

One is an 81-year-old retiree, the other a 97\*-year old vintage Austin 7, but neither is limited to the island's roads.

They take part in time trials; hill climbs and are off to Victoria in April for the centenary celebrations for the first Austin 7 built in the UK.

"It's such a wonderful car to drive," said Mr McCarthy, who moved to Bribie in 2000.

"Alfred, my car, is appreciated by many. People take pictures and videos.

The police (on Bribie) wave to us.

"It brings back many happy memories to those old enough to remember when Austin 7s were all people could afford."

The Austin 7 was built from 1922 to 1939 in two-door and three-door van models becoming so popular it replaced most other British economy cars and sidecars.

It was advertised at a price of 50 pounds and giving 50 miles to the gallon!

Mr McCarthy bought his first Austin 7 in Brisbane at the age of 16. It was the start of a life-long love affair and today he has three registered vehicles.

At the age of 75 Mr McCarthy started racing at Morgan Park Raceway, War wick in a 16km time trial. Alfred, built by vintage car restorer Rob Gabb now with a new chassis, was last on that occasion but a new journey had begun. since competed in time trails at Wondai, done the Noosa Hill Climb, Leyburn Sprints and raced at Lakeside in Kurwongbah.

Alfred's top speed on the hill climb is around 55km/h and on tracks approaching 100km/h.

The Duo was last on that occasion, and Mr McCarthy says he is helping "keep motoring history alive" as possibly the oldest driver in in the oldest car on tracks in Queensland ... also in the only vehicle with a crank handle. The Noosa Hill Climb in late February may be their next competition and then a trip to Warrnambool, Victoria, for April's rally to mark the centenary of the Austin 7.
