Cars of the Stars– The Baby Austin goes to Hollywood!


When the American Austin was made in the USA, more were sold in California than anywhere, many to entertainers. 52,000 were ordered before it debuted in June 1930!




Buster Keaton takes his two sons for a tour of the MGM lot in an Austin Roadster used in the Movie "Parlour,

Roscoe Conkling "Fatty" Arbuckle was a silent movie star, whose career took a dive after a scandal resulted in a series of trials in the early 1920s, he was eventually acquitted but his popularity evaporated. In 1932 his career began to take off again, and he signed up for a new movie deal after making a few comedy shorts but unfortunately he died of a fatal heart attack in 1933 at the age of 46. Here is "Fatty" trying out an Austin coupe for size. (I do think he should have tried a couple of sizes larger!) In his earlier days "Fatty" drove around in this Pierce Arrow, a much larger luxury car.

The famous Al Jolson, star of Screen and the recording Studio, ordered his Austin months in advance of




its release, and was the first private owner to receive one of the iconic little cars.

Al is more well known as the first person to speak in a movie, 1927's 'The Jazz Singer''. Jolson's "Wait a minute" line provoked shouts of pleasure and applause from the audience, who were dumbfounded by seeing and hearing someone speak on a film for the first time. Songs were only just beginning to be played in synchronisation with movies using the "Vitaphone" process, to have a real live talkie was the next step!



George "Slim" Summerville was one of the original Keystone Cops, here he shows he had his own unique way getting in and out of his coupe. Being tall and gangly Slim was popular as a comedic extra. He also directed 50 films, mostly comedy shorts. His acting work extended from 1912 to 1946, including two movies with Shirley Temple.



Actress and Soprano Bernice Claire is happily pictured on top of an Austin Coupe for publicity purposes. She starred in 13 films in the 1930s including "No, No, Nannette" and lived a long and happy life till she was 97.

Actor Marion Davies contemplates her dilemma is a scene from a long-forgotten comedy. She starred in 51 movies from 1917 to 1937 and was also known for her relationship with millionaire Randolph Hearst. After she inherited 170,000 shares of Hearst Corporation shares when Hearst died in 1951 in addition to another 30,000 in a trust fund previously set up for her, Marion later donated nearly 3 million dollars to charities, some of it went to setting up a children's hospital at the University College of Los Angeles.

This sent me down a worm hole to dig out a delightful and well-illustrated book I have called 'What Became of the Baby Austin" written by John Underwood in 1965 about the history of the American Austin (later called the Bantam) to find additional the additional photos of Hollywood celebrities to go with this article. More on the American Austin

American Austin Car Company set up manufacturing operations in Butler, Pennsylvania, in premises that had belonged to the Standard Steel Car Company. Their intention was to assemble and sell in the United States a version of the Austin 7 car, called the American Austin. The Austin automobile was designed in the hopes of creating a market for small-car enthusiasts in the United States. The cars had 747 cc (45.6 cu in) inline-four engines, enabling the car to return 40 mpg-US (48 mpg-imp; 5.9 L/100 km), and travel 1,000 miles or 1,600 kilometres per 2 US qt (1.7 imp qt; 1.9 L) fill of oil. It was capable of 50 mph (80 km/h) in high gear. Styling resembled small Chevrolets, with Stutz- and Marmon-style horizontal hood louvres. The bodies were designed by Alexis de Sakhnoffsky and made by the Hayes Body Company of Detroit. The coupe was billed as a sedan, and sold for \$445, slightly less than a Ford V8 roadster. The Great Depression made the cheaper second-hand cars more appealing, so sales dropped off to the point that production was suspended. American Austin produced 8,448 cars that were sold during 1930, the company's first (and best) year of sales but only 1,279 vehicles were built in 1931. In 1934 the company filed for bankruptcy protection and in 1935 the company was liquidated.

The assets were acquired by Evans Operations, Inc. and a new company American Bantam Car Company was incorporated in June 1936 which was made until 1940 and had a part in the evolution of the Jeep. In 1938 30 % of Bantams production was exported. A contract was made to distribute the bantam in Australia and early in February 1938 the first shipment for 50 cars were sent to Melbourne.

I remember the late Roy Ducat telling me that as a young chap he worked for the company that had the job to build the bodies on the Bantam. Australian Bantams had smaller lights than their American cousins, Roy told me this was because the box containing the headlights was dropped into the harbour when they were unloading the parts.

JAGUAR - HOW THE BRAND EVOLVED (with help of the Austin Seven!)

Jaguar Cars was a British car manufacturer initially established in Blackpool by two motorcycle enthusiasts (William Lyons and William Walmsley) as the Swallow Sidecar Company.

This was in September 1922, and they originally made motorcycle sidecars prior to expanding and developing bodies for motorcars.

In 1927 the company name was changed to The Swallow Sidecar and Coach Building Company and Swallow began to produce the Austin Seven Swallow car built on a standard Austin chassis.

A change of premises, and by while 1928. still producing sidecars, production had increased to about 50 cars a week. The name changed again to the Swallow Coachbuilding Co several and new models followed with the company starting to build complete cars in association with the

Standard Motor Company, many bearing Jaguar as a model name. In 1934 the company was renamed, becoming S.S. Cars Ltd.

Late in 1935 the S.S. Jaguar 100 was released. This was the first sports car to carry the Jaguar name. It had a



3.5 litre engine and was capable of more than 100mph. In 1945 the company changed its name to became Jaguar Cars Ltd.
