Editorial Comments

My fellow committee member, Robyn Clark, sends me all manner of online newsletters from other clubs. One that recently took my interest was "The Good Oil", aka the Official journal of the Ipswich Veteran and Vintage Vehicle Club who are holding a special invitation event for their club's 50th Anniversary. By the time you receive this newsletter it is probably too late for you to register for this event as entries had to be in by the Sunday the 14th of June.

Also in the "Good Oil" is a story about the origins of the Ipswich Club which I have added below.



"Early in 1974, the Veteran Car Club of Australia (Qld) held an invitation rally for the Fernvale State school centenary and several Brisbane clubs attended with a good gathering of both veteran and vintage vehicles. Nev Grice attended in his 1928 Dodge and during the day, he noticed that most of the cars attending all came from the Ipswich area. Nev then arranged for all Ipswich people to meet at the Shell service station on Fernvale Road on their way home. At the gathering John Griffiths suggested a further meeting to be held at Ron Griffith's sawmill at Raceview. On Wednesday 22nd May 1974, 37 people attended the gathering at Raceview. A further meeting was held on Friday 7th June and 34 people attended. A third meeting was advertised in the Queensland Times to be held in the Scout Hall at Cameron Park Booval on 11th July 1974 where 35 people joined and the Ipswich Veteran and Vintage Vehicle Club was formed. 29 people lined up to pay for membership for the 35 foundation members on the night." Amongst the members were Bill Jones Snr. and May Jones, John Hoerlein, Clarrie Hoffman, Nev Grice and Darryl Stark, individuals whose vehicles were well known regular rally attendees throughout SE Qld and several of our longer serving A7 members would remember and have been on runs with.


A UNIQUE OPPORTUNITY TO BUY A STEAM POWERED A7!!

"I am sitting at my desk in Central Victoria and have just read the article on the Comet.


You mention in the article that you only know of one serving Comet.

From the info that is in the article I can tell you that there are two survivors. I am a member of the Victorian Austin 7 club that has rejoined after 40 years.

Now back in 1980 the Vic Club had a long-term member Roy Thomson, who owned a Comet HYM-157 (Vic Rego).

He had told me that he had purchased his Comet from what seemed to be a deceased estate in the late 1950's.

Roy had no next of kin apart from a nephew who was not at the time going to let the Comet out his sight, but I have been told by current members of the Vic Club that the car has now gone to

Sydney NSW. Sorry, I don't know the current owner. (This would appear to be the car owned by Merv and Maureen Boatwright now in Sydney -Ed) So, I think there are at least two survivors, and it makes you wonder when there were 600 produced.


