Friday 17th. Visit a Barramundi Fish farm and enjoy morning tea there. They can supply morning tea and coffee, with Scones, jam and cream, or bring your own. I will have more on that later as well. Nice drive to this 35 K's to start the morning. Then over to the Bargara Golf Club for lunch with a magnificent view over the ocean whilst enjoying your meal. Another good drive through some back roads. After lunch we will divide into two groups, one heading to Greensills Sweet Potato farm and packing shed while the other will go to The Lavender farm. We will then do a swap over so as to visit both venues.

From there we will meet up again and head back into Bundaberg and visit the Barrell which is home to the famous Bundaberg Ginger Beer and all beautiful other varieties.

Saturday 18th Heritage Day at the Precinct in Bundaberg where we will be part of this day and have a Static Display of our fantastic little Austin's. It is up to you as to how you fill in your day either staying at the Precinct or looking at some Op shops or enjoying our lovely city. A thought we have had is that Sat afternoon after Heritage day has finished we take a short trip to Kalkie Moon a local brewing company. Here you can sample and purchase their award winning Gins and Liquers. Then maybe on Sat night we can make use of the Caravan BBQ area and have a Sausage sizzle or BBQ with a bring your own everything. This is just a thought at the moment, your feed back would be welcome

Sunday 19th Visit a private, huge collection of cars, tractors etc. Brian and I were blown away at this and feel this is a must to see. Morning tea will be provided for a Gold Coin donation, or again bring your own. More info later on morning tea.

Off down to Burnett Heads to the local Pub for lunch. Then a pleasant drive along the Burnett River to the Port Marina.

Monday 20th We have an option of farms in our mind that we can visit on Monday morning this is not finalised as yet, but be assured it will be fun.

From there we head to The Botanical Gardens in Bundaberg which house The Hinkler Hall of Aviation where you can sit in the Cockpit of a replica of Bert's Avro Baby aeroplane. Bert Hinklers original house which was dismantled in England and bought out to Bundaberg and erected in the gardens.

The Bundaberg and District Historical Museum, Japanese gardens and a lovely drive around the Botanical gardens also Fairymead house, Australian Sugarcane Railway and The Bundaberg Railway Museum.

There is also a Steam Train which has its tracks around the gardens and normally only runs on the weekends, we are endeavouring to see if we can get this going for our visit. Most of these exhibits have an entry fee which you can decide if you wish to explore.

There is a Restaurant located here in the Gardens with a huge variety for you to select. From there we will head back to our accommodation and get ready for our Farewell Dinner which is at "The Spotted Dog Tavern"

Hopefully this helps, but we still have a few things to finalise.
