THE EDITOR'S BIT

2017 promises to be a very memorable year for the Austin & Register of Queensland. Not only are we about to host one of the best, (if not THE best) National Tours in only a few short months, but this is also 50 years since a group of Brisbane based Austin Seven owners decided to create a register of Austin Sevens to encourage the preservation and restoration at a time when many cars were in danger of being left to rot or destroyed. At the top left hand side of the letter head is the original badge of the Register which has been used as the Register's car badge since its inception and was drawn up by the late Alison Kenward. From 1967 -1972 the Register was simply that, a list of owners and cars that was compiled by Greg Riddell and Peter Baker, and occasional meetings were held Peter's house, the first in August 1967.

The other badge on the right was created about the same time the Register had its first Static Display in the Sherwood Arboretum in about 1974. Now the Register became more of a formal entity with regular meetings, with the first quarterly newsletter in November 1973, the first yearly list of Members in June 1972, both were using the Rectangular design rather than the Oval "Q". From 1967 -1975 Peter and Jenny Baker ran the club, but in 1975 Graham Cogzell became the second president.

(I do hope I have all this right, I only joined in 1976, but I am sure someone will remember)

But first we need to concentrate on the National Tour in Toowoomba, the Tour Committee has been spending many hours, travelled many miles and dealing with many people in local businesses, the local council and local car clubs to make this an extra special event. Now we know that not everyone is able to enter the Tour, but that does not mean that you will not be welcome to come and inspect the cars at one of the many stops and venues throughout the week we are in Toowoomba. If you would like to come up one day and have a look, I have included a list of the best venues in this newsletter. You will also be very interested to know that you could have a chance to see some very interesting Austin Sevens of all different types all together, many possibly for the first and only time. For instance, there will be two rare Austin 7 Swallow Saloons, 5 Nippy's and the very rare and very special 1931 Austin 7 Racing Car, the "Rubber Duck" (pictured above.)

It is interesting that all this newsletter's Tour Reports seem to be centred around eating, we were eating Chinese food Christmas, we were eating breakfast for the New Year and Australia Day we were stilling eating sausages on bread rolls. I wonder if the number one New Year's resolution for members is to eat less and exercise more?

The Editor is pleased to say he now has a set of 19" wheels fitted to the 1934 Nippy "Red Rocket" with English made "Avon Side Car Triple Duty Mk II" tires, to ensure it stays on the road better. Pricing around for sand blasting and powder coating rusty wheels that had been scrounged from various kind hearted club members, the



best deal was from a firm called Cooper and Ward at 30 Leonard Crescent, Brendale (3205 2833). They were sand blasted, primed and coated in shiny black paint for \$100 each. The service and turn-around time was very good. They also do domestic work like garden furniture, shelving, etc.



Two cars that have not been entered as part of the official tour but plan to be up at Toowoomba for the display day at the Cobb & Co. 

A Star returns, the "Duck" is coming to Toowoomba



Ian Moore from the UK, who is the current owner of the famous sole surviving 1931 Works Austin 7 Racing Car, OX 9818, informs us that this famous car is stored in Victoria and Ian has told us we will see it on display at Toowoomba. These cars were nicked named the "Dutch Clog" or the "Rubber Duck"

lan sent us a selection of pictures of the Car including is this one of the "Duck" being raced at Brooklands, this picture shows the car refuelling at the International 500-mile race, held on the 22nd September 1934. The car raced from 1931 to 1935, before it was shipped to the Austin Distributors in New Zealand. In 1936 it was transported to South Australia to take part in the

Australian Grand Prix in Victor Harbour.

Previously this car was owned by Grant Cowie who completely restored the car, including having a brand-new crankcase cast as the original (and unique) was damaged beyond repair many years ago, and we were treated to seeing this car finally restored in Ballarat at the 2002 National Rally.



News Snippets from the Queensland Historic Motoring Council Inc.

Some clubs are still pushing for a log book system as used in other states, NSW is conducting a 2-year trial. Qld Transport and Main Roads (TMR) are not considering a log book system until the results of the NSW trial. TMR tell us that their computer system would need updating if we are to use log books, and any cost will be passed to the clubs, meaning a much more expensive scheme than we have now!! The existing scheme is much more lenient than some people realise.

For instance, we are now informed by TMR that if our club sanctions the use (and you are not getting paid) you can drive to a wedding or school formal for people who are not direct relatives.

Also, we can drive our cars to any event organised by an incorporated car club, (such as an invitation event organised by an Austin 7 Club in NSW or Victoria or WA)

Brand new 36 spoke 3.50 x19" wheels with centre stainless steel cap to suit all Austin 7s. All new from Hub to rim. Made in India for Enfield County. (I believe these may be the same people who make the new Royal Enfield Motor Bike). Cost is \$322.98 AUD including delivery, but recently these have been advertised on EBay for \$284.22 AUD.
