

# Overview of Austin 7 Register of Queensland

Overview of the Austin Seven Register of Queensland Inc.

The Register was formed in 1967 by enthusiasts who owned Austin Sevens and has continued for 42 years and still going strong. At the beginning new parts were scarce and donor Austin Sevens were used for restorations to make roadworthy vehicles.

There are approximately 110 members in the club with the majority living in Queensland and others from Victoria, New south Wales and the Northern Territory.

The membership remains static from year to year even though cars are bought and sold.

There are approximately 150 Austin Sevens on the Register comprising of Chummy, Tourers, Utilities, Vans with a Big Seven Utility and Tourer. There are a number under restoration which have been a bag of bones to start with.

Most of the Austin's have Australia bodies but there are a few which were imported.

There are some members with expert skills to help with technical matters. The Internet is also a useful tool to source information

We carry a good range of spare parts locally and obtain replacements from the Austin Seven Club in Victoria and from the UK and New Zealand.

The Register meets on the second Friday of each month at 7.45pm, Veteran Car Club Hall, 1376 Old Cleveland Road, Carindale, in Brisbane, with a club run the following Sunday.

A Newsletter is produced every second month for each member and a Spare Parts and Membership Book is also supplied to financial members. We also have a small web site for our country and interstate members to seek information from.
