Centenary Event News - 4th April 2021



Dear Austin Seven Enthusiast,

Happy Easter; and if you are receiving a newsletter from us for the first time, welcome! You are in good company as we already have nearly 1,000 subscribers and there are still 470 days to go until the start of what promises to be the biggest ever gathering of Austin Seven enthusiasts and their friends and families.

I am writing to bring you the latest news about the exciting activities that we are planning for The Austin Seven Centenary Celebration which runs from **19th to 24th July 2022** at the Fire Service College at Moreton in Marsh, Gloucestershire. During the event week there will be a great many things to do and something very special indeed will be taking place on **Wednesday**, **20th July 2022**.

THE CENTENARY FESTIVAL OF AUSTIN 7 COMPETITION HISTORY

Those who know their Austin Seven history will recall that on 7th July 1922 the Austin works driver, Louis Kings, took the Austin Seven prototype, registration OK 2950, up Shelsley Walsh Hill Climb to the 'great appreciation of the crowds'. This was in advance of the car being made available for sale to the general public and was a truly seminal

moment in the development of the Austin Seven.

(Photo courtesy of the Austin Harris Collection) It was also the start of the wonderful Austin Seven sporting heritage that went on to touch the lives and influence the careers of so many famous people - Campbell, Moss, Hill, Chapman, McLaren, Issigonis, Cooper, and countless others. One hundred years on - to the month - and as part of the Centenary Celebration week at Moreton in Marsh, we shall be holding the Centenary Festival of Austin 7 Competition History at Prescott Hill Climb, well known as the home of the Bugatti Owners Club who have very kindly agreed to us inundating their property with Austin Sevens.



The Festival day, which is being organised by **Charlie Plain-Jones** and a band of willing helpers, will re-create the historic moment of the Austin Seven's first competitive outing and will feature a cavalcade of competition Austin Sevens celebrating its sporting prowess over the past 100 years. And you and your Austin Seven can take part too!

"As part of the week-long Centenary event based at Moreton in Marsh, and to celebrate 100 years of Austin 7 sporting achievements, this public event at Prescott Hill Climb on Wednesday, 20th July 2022 will bring together some of the rarest competition cars demonstrating their stuff on this famous hill climb course, plus the opportunity to drive your Austin 7 up the track.

Interest in the event, particularly amongst those lucky enough to own these exotic cars, is already running at a high level and visitors will be guaranteed a never to be repeated occasion of historic significance.

Not only will the event look back on the immense influence the Austin 7 has had on British society and even on the shape of Formula



1 to this day; it will also look forward as motoring as we know it changes beyond all recognition in only a few short years.

Whatever the developments in the technology, the spirit in which the Austin 7 was born – affordable personal transport for the millions - will be certain to remain.

We are also delighted to announce that The Festival will be benefitting one of our major charities, Parkinson's UK, who fund research and support sufferers from this most distressing of diseases. It cruelly and progressively robs a person of all their abilities including movement and speech, leaving them locked in and totally unable to communicate. Sufferers have included Billy Connolly, Muhammed Ali, Pope John-Paul II – and my dad... There will be fundraising activities taking place throughout the day and we hope that everyone attending will give generously to this deserving cause."

Road-going Sevens will be able to take to the hill and as this is not a competitive event, and runs will not be timed, there will be no requirement for race licences or safety equipment in the vehicles.

The spirits of the Austin works drivers, including the likes of Waite, Hadley, Petre, Goodacre, Driscoll, Dodson, and designer, Murray Jamieson, will no doubt approve of us all enjoying a tantalising taste of what they experienced in-period.

Prescott Hill Climb is a picturesque twenty-mile drive through Cotswold countryside from Morton-in-Marsh. The track is nearly a mile long and has excellent viewing locations along almost the entire length. The parkland setting provides a relaxed and pleasant garden-party atmosphere for all the family and the restaurant and bar will be open throughout the day.

Those attending the Centenary Celebration at Moreton in Marsh and coming as visitors to the Festival at Prescott will

have use of an exclusive parking and picnic area in the Orchard next to the start line, plus the unique opportunity to take their car and passengers up the historic hill climb track.

Visitors will also be able to enjoy the on-site Bugatti Trust museum, which is dedicated to Ettore Bugatti's engineering achievements on the road, on water, in the air, and even on rails!

Booking for the Centenary Festival of Austin 7 Competition History day will open in September 2021 on the Centenary Celebration event website.

Useless, but interesting, trivia...

Did you know that Moreton in Marsh's wartime RAF station (on the site of where the Fire Service College now stands) is reputed to have inspired the BBC and Radio Luxembourg series 'Much-Binding-in-the-Marsh?



Starring Kenneth Horne and Richard Murdoch along with Nicholas Parsons, Maurice Denham, Sam Costa, and Dora Bryan, the radio series began in 1944 and lasted until 1954. Its theme tune is still fondly remembered by many.

The weekly episodes followed the antics on a fictional RAF station as its staff battled red tape and wartime inconveniences. 'Binding' was RAF slang for complaining vociferously about problems .

Kenneth Horne joined the RAF during the war and served on a barrage balloon unit. Before the war he had a career with Triplex – the firm responsible for so many safety glass windscreens – and after the war became chairman of Chad Valley, the toy manufacturer. Until 1958 he kept broadcasting as a sideline interest but following a stroke he gave up business to concentrate on entertainment - including, of course, the wonderful 'Round the Horne'.Charlie has written to tell us the latest news about this thrilling part of the Centenary week programme

It is with great sadness that we have lost a long-time club member and friend to many due to cancer. Geoff joined TDAMC in the late 1970's and had taken on many roles on the club's committee. He has been our



registration officer since 2002 and on the social committee since 2011.

After Geoff left school, he became a qualified mechanic and then became a Service Advisor at McGrath Motors in Liverpool where he met Beth. He gained a wide knowledge of Holdens and Chevrolets. After he and Beth were married they moved to Bogan Gate, near Parkes, and managed the shop which had been run down. They then moved to Tamworth with their sons in the 1970's where Geoff set up his own business: Gem Engines, travelling the North West, and later developed into Engines 4U and Imports 4U. His sons now run the business since he retired.

His knowledge of historic cars was immense. He restored Austin Sevens in his early days of TDAMC as well as a few other makes of cars. Then he had Holdens, a Dodge,

Mustang, Nash Metropolitan, Chevrolets and Morris Minor Travellers. Many of which he had to rebuild parts, panel beat, spray paint and carry out mechanical work. He imported some of his cars from overseas and then had to rebuild them due to having lots of rust. The car he was last working on was his third Morris Minor Traveller which he had almost completed. He had lots of energy and would have cars restored quite quickly. Sometimes he would still be doing running repairs when going on a rally and Beth would wait patiently, doing her crocheting, as she knew Geoff would be able to sort out the problem.

As well as restoring cars he loved going on our local club runs as well as many rallies away from home. Especially enjoyed the Hat Head Rally. He won numerous trophies for his restorations as well as ones from our club, even our club's Dyke Award for mishaps; such as using a piece of garden hose at a motel to replace a broken bush in his Morrie. He loved music and on one rally, at the motel, he connected up speakers to run a Mpeg-4 USB flash drive, so he had music while travelling. In fact, most of his cars were set up that way.

If you wanted information on old cars you just had to ask Geoff. He would tell you how to fix things on your car and let you know where to source parts.

The funeral for Geoff was held on 18th November at the Open- Air Chapel, Showground Rd. Our club members formed a guard of honour and many of them turned up in their classic cars. Geoff's sons and their families arrived in his cars:

He had a great sense of humour, cheerful, was a good conversationalist, a friend to many and like a family member to some of us in our car club. We will miss him immensely; we will forever remember him.

Geoff was a loving husband and father, a mentor to his sons and would often attend their music gigs. A huge loss to Beth, the boys and their families and also our car club. Our condolences go out to Beth, Dion, Stuart, Brent, Vaughan (Chook) and their families. - *Val Grout*

The Birth of The Haynes Manuals

The Haynes manuals are named after John Harold Haynes (1938–2019).



John Haynes was born in Ceylon (now Sri Lanka) to Violette and

Harold, a tea plantation manager. In 1950 the family returned to the UK, where, with his brother David, John attended Sutton Valence school near Maidstone in Kent. There John persuaded

his headmaster to allow him to miss his rugby lessons so that he could rebuild his £15 Austin 7 saloon into one of the

the 17-year-old sell the finished car at a profit; he decided he would write a booklet about the project. Drawing all the illustrations himself, he ran off 250 copies on a stencil duplicator in 1956. The 44 page book on "Building a 750 Special" sold out in 10 days at five shillings a copy.

He then wrote two further books while performing national service in the Royal Air Force and later joined the Air Force for a further period, receiving a good grounding in business and logistical skills and finding time to race his Elva Courier car.. In 1959 John then published an expanded book on "How to build Austin Specials" published under the "Auto-

Publications" name. The book must have been popular as there were 3 editions printed in 1959 alone. These are the books that launched a thousand specials.

He also got married: his wedding present in 1963 to Annette (nee Coleman-Brown) was a second hand IBM proportional-spacing typewriter, which she used to produce the early Haynes manuals.

Johns First book as J. H. Haynes & Co. Limited was founded on 18 May 1960 and the first manual actually entitled "Haynes Owners Workshop Manual", for the Austin-Healey Sprite, was published in 1965. Haynes was made an Officer of Order of the British Empire in the Queen's Birthday Honours List 1995 for services to publishing. He died on 8 February 2019, aged 80.

Many Haynes Manuals bear a cover illustration of a cutaway view technical drawing of the vehicle, handdrawn by Terry Davey.

In 2013, Haynes acquired Clymer repair manuals from Penton Media. In 2020, Haynes was acquired by Infopro Digital, a technical data company owned by TowerBrook Capital Partners, for £114.5 million. (*info from the Guardian and Wikipedia*)

A reproduction of Hayne's 1956 book was recently included with TKC (Track, Kit, Custom) magazine for Jan/Feb 2021.(Published by British company CAR PR Ltd.) I went back for a second copy but they had all gone!!! The magazine has a red Mini on the cover.

<u>"The Sinclair Family Austin Seven Odyssey"</u>

1956 - WANGANUI -NEW ZEALAND

"you will never fix that", the neighbour said as Rod Sinclair towed the Austin 7 into the driveway of the family home.

If were a person it would have been in intensive care. The entire body was pushed in from the rear where a truck had run into it, leaving only room to sit behind the steering wheel."

And so begins the 65 year association of the Sinclair family with a 1929 Chummy The little Austin chassis number 94050, had 9 owners over 27 years and was bought to wreck for spare parts for Rod's wrecking yard, but instead he decided to keep it for the family, being the ideal car for his 4 young sons to learn to drive with its sudden in and out clutch, reasoning that if they could drive the Austin they could drive anything. It was repaired and towed behind the family's 1938 Maple Leaf Chevrolet Bus to many of New Zealand's North Island camp spots, from Northland down to the Bay of Islands thru the late 1950s until it was retired in 1971 as the boys Nick, Jan, Bren and Glynn, grew up and branched away.

Then in 1981 It was driven down from Wanganui to Wellington and back by Nick and his patient wife Roseanne, a 380 km return trip, with one door missing, and boiling its head off just after leaving Wellington to climb over the infamous Ngauranga Gorge to reach the Kapiti Coast. Then in 1982 it returned to Wellington and was transhipped on a pallet inside an aircraft to quarantine at Brisbane Airport. Next day, the car cleared Customs and Nick and Roseanne then filled the fuel tank, installed a charged battery and drove the tatty but almost complete Chummy to Labrador, on the Gold Coast where they stopped under trees pouring steam again!

Nick joined the A7 Register in 1984 when he started the "3 Bs rebuild (buggered, broken or bent)" . having the body repaired by Syd Wickham at Currumbin, nick then working thru the chassis and the motor finally got a complete rebuild in the 1990s, using parts sourced thru the register.

Forward to last year Nick finally completed a project that was hanging around for several years, a book about his families' ownership of their little Cream and brown "Chum". The result is a lovely little



story about a remarkable car, told with humour by Nick as he relates growing up with an Austin in the family. Nick has donated a copy to our club library and I also have a cherished copy. Nick is selling copies for \$15 each. The book is 50 pages A5 size and has several colour photos taken during the 65 year ownership.

A Early History of Number Plates in Queensland

Queensland first introduced registration numbers on 10th September1906. Early registration plates were not provided by the Government, but generally made by the car owner or local garage and were made from a variety of materials including tin, wood or leather.

The first plate A1 was assigned to A. Carmichael of Peel Street, South Brisbane. Different Towns in Queensland were allocated different prefix letters:



A **Brisbane**, B Rockhampton, C Toowoomba ,D Townsville, E Ipswich, F Maryborough, G Warwick, H Cairns, J Bundaberg, K Mackay, M Clermont, N Gympie, P Hughenden, R Dalby and Redcliffe.

On 1st July1921, the system changed and the first Q plate appeared and issued to James McGuire of the Newmarket Hotel for his 1921 Crossley and Q7 went to George Perry of Windermere rd., Hamilton for his Wolseley. These first Q plates had both the Q and the numerals painted white on a black background. From 1st April 1925, the Q was painted black on a white background and the numerals remained white. Most

existing Q plates were then repainted so that the Q was painted black to keep the system standard.

Year of issue: 1921 Q1, 1922 Q8-183, 1923 Q13-923, 1924 Q21-435, 1925 Q32-725, 1926 Q47-921, 1927 Q67-736 1928, Q86-510 1929, Q104-716 The system continued with 6 numerals after the Q until the last plate Q687-612 was issued on 31st May 1955.

In 1985 the Qld. MRD in a fit of frenzy had a big Auction of legally reissued Q1 to Q100 plates plus other number combinations likely to appeal to people who wanted a date to go with their car, (Q1948) or model type such as a Porsche (Q356) thus possibly tainting the historical significance of the few cars that still carried an original Q plate. On top of this you also paid \$500 to \$1000 transfer fee!



The first numberplate registered in the UK was A-1. The idea of number plates didn't originate in the UK

but was an idea adopted from the Dutch. The very first number plate ever registere d was the "A1"



1905 Renault owned by the AA in the UK since 1965. They also own AA-1 and AA-3 which they bought from the Winchester Council

plate. When the *A dormant Austin 7 box Saloon still* system was first *carries its 1933 registration plates* introduced in 1903 thanks to the Motor Car Act of that year, this now famous plate was claimed by the

Earl Russell. Or rather, it was claimed by his butler, who was commanded to queue overnight at the London County Council to receive it. The A1 plate still remains an intensely collectable item, currently belonging to the brother of the Sultan of Brunei. The first plates ever issued in the USA were released by Massachusetts in 1903. They gave drivers porcelain plates, as this was before the invention of metal stamped plates. The numbers began with one and this first license plate was issued to Fredrick Tudor.

Lord Austin had given Kay Petre a place in his works Austin racing team, appointing her to drive the blown side-valve car while the men raced the Jamieson twin-cam Austins. As an official Austin driver Kay chalked-up notable successes for the Birmingham manufacturer.
