

DEAR AUSTIN SEVEN ENTHUSIAST,

Following the frenzy that accompanied the launch of the online booking system we have sold out of on-site accommodation; sold out of sports facility tickets; and sold out of places for road-going Austin Sevens to go up the hill at the Prescott Festival on the Wednesday. You may of course still attend the Prescott event as a spectator. So far as Centenary Event entry tickets and restaurant meals are concerned, there are still plenty to be had. And there is still a reasonable quantity of camping pitches

available, but...

The number of entry tickets already sold and the ongoing rate of bookings leave us in no doubt whatsoever that we shall reach capacity in the not-too-distant-future.

There is also no doubt that we will have at least 1,000 Sevens attending. It's all really rather amazing! I therefore strongly urge you NOT to delay booking your entry tickets and camping pitches as otherwise you may find yourself disappointed. If you are talking with other A7 enthusiasts please do let them know the situation.

#### **UPDATE 2ND NOVEMBER 2021**

There may be 56 shopping days until Christmas but there are just 258 days until we open the doors to the Austin Seven Centenary Event, and I can't help feeling that both periods of time will evaporate very quickly indeed!

It's interesting to see that many sales advertisements for Austin Sevens now carry a line about 'ideal for the Centenary next year' - and of course that's correct. What better reason could there be than to invest in an Austin now so as to be able to be part of the biggest event of its kind - ever?

You'll recall that we are aiming to have 1,000 Austin Sevens on site and that in the previous newsletter I told you there was no doubt we will achieve that number. As of this morning there are well over 800 Sevens booked in so I reckon that it's a dead cert we shall hit the 1000 mark before those 56 shopping days to Christmas are done. During the Centenary Event one thing is for sure - we won't be short of things to do and things to see. In fact it is quite likely that the biggest challenge will be deciding just what to choose from the range of activities and entertainments that will be on offer.

#### FANCY DOING AN END-TO-END RUN?

Not part of the Centenary Event, but a welcome addition to celebrations during the centenary year, news comes from the South Wales Austin Seven Club that they are setting up an 'End to End' run from John O'Groats to Lands End - or vice versa - for 2022.

It will be relatively informal as there won't be any booking-in tents at either end, instead people will be required to take a picture of their car at either end and outside the Longbridge gates. The photos will form part of the certificate in addition to the names of the drivers that took part.

There is no set route or direction, but to help people take a safe approach to the run they need to take longer than 24 hours to complete it.

The photos must be taken between 1am on Saturday 9th April 2022 and midnight on Sunday 24th April 2022. A 16 day window will make it easier for people to book a holiday, take a more scenic route, or avoid bad weather.

We have a strictly limited capacity for the event and once the entry tickets are sold out (which will likely happen in the next few weeks), that's it.

We have been saying it repeatedly and I'll say it again - if you want to be at the Centenary Event you really should buy your entry tickets now.

It would be helpful if you could let your A7 friends know this and also ask your clubs to make it known to all members.

This is not a marketing ploy, it's a genuine message to our subscribers because we don't want any of you to be disappointed that you can't get in.

#### "I am coming in a classic/vintage car that isn't an Austin Seven, is there a special parking area?"

We have been asked about this a number of times and the answer is that although we are pleased to welcome people with vehicles other than Austin Sevens there will be no special parking areas for them as we do not have the space - it's mostly taken up by A7s.

So other marques/models will be parked with the Moderns in a designated section of the site but only Austin Sevens will be in the main areas.

You may like to know that this week we booked in the entry for the 900th Austin Seven. Our 1,000 target is very close to being met!


Greenbank, around 20-minutes' drive from the Clarks' residence.

servicing information. Another gives specs on brake linings, points, plugs, valves, bearings etc. When telling people you have an Austin 10, mention it is a Cambridge Roadster and if they know their old cars, they will be familiar with which Ten it is. There is a later 1939 to 47 model, but it is a different car." The body possibly may be by Charles Hope.

Late in October our parts man Trevor was contacted by Roger Liddle in Ingham saying he needed 2 front springs for the front of his "Austin 7" Trevor told him it could not be an A7. Then Roger replied it was always known as an A7.

Roger and his wife Heather sent some photos but they show the car has rod brakes and different springs in the back. The photos were sent to the Editor, and finally armed with the original engine number I was able to identify their Austin.

#### STALE FUEL

Many of us store unleaded petrol in a can for several weeks and there is always a few gallons (whoops; several litres) in the car's tank as it stands unused between outings. I have been told that petrol 'goes off' after about three weeks, but what effect might using stale fuel have on a 'Seven'? I did a 'Google' search for 'stale fuel' and found some information on several question and answer sites.

To précis the answers I found: Apparently you can store fuel in a sealed container, kept cool and out of direct sunlight, for around six months before it starts to deteriorate. If the container is not properly sealed, or is frequently opened, the fuel will start to evaporate and some of the light components in the fuel can be lost. The light components include butane and as they are lost, the fuel loses its volatility, and the car is difficult to start.

Fuel in the car tank can last for up to four weeks before it becomes much denser. When this happens, the engine is effectively over-fuelled and there's an increased chance of carbon deposits onto spark plugs and inside the combustion chamber.

Others stated that fuel will go off in the fuel tank quite quickly once it's a couple of weeks old and felt that the brand of fuel was a contributory factor. One recommended that it is good practice to add about 25% fresh fuel to the tank every few weeks. Extract from article by Doug Castle CA7C Seven Focus October 2008 pp2-2

Fine, so perhaps it is best with a little used historic car to keep the fuel level in the tank relatively low, and only fill up with as much as you will need for the outing; ie do not refuel before arriving home from a run and then leave the car standing for several weeks but fill up before the run.

The low compression 'Seven' engine was designed to run on low grade petrol available in the 1920's/30's apparently equivalent to 74 Octane, so 95 Octane unleaded petrol that might become a 'stale' 91-93 Octane fuel is still well above the original design criterion for our engine.

#### Wayne continues

"After experiencing the stale fuel issue with my chummy, camping generator and lawn mower I had the opportunity to be invited to a 'talk' on the matter by an industry leader and as a consequence changed what I am doing.

Probably like most Austin 7 folk I add 'Flashlube' to my fuel to reduce the incidence of valve damage and I add a small quantity of two stroke oil to my fuel to assist with the problem of sticking valves as I don't use my Austin regularly but Penrite have a new product called 'fuel stabiliser' which I have been using successfully for some time and it extends the life of unleaded fuel for up to a year. It is also recommended to add it to fresh fuel only.

Apparently the higher the octane the faster the fuel goes off but as I always use 91 grade without ethanol it works for me."
