Hi Everyone

Thank you for your patience and understanding. As you are aware, Corona virus is still with us and its unpredictability has led us to <u>postpone this year's Austins Over Australia for twelve months</u>. We plan to hold the event around the same time in 2022.

We are unable at this point to guarantee the safety of our participants, nor are we able to obtain solid dates and pricing from the local council and businesses supplying AOA. Similarly, we note that potential sponsors have been reluctant to participate.

We plan to re-assess the situation in August, keeping in mind the roll-out of vaccines, opening of borders and the broader ability for people to be safe around others. 

Brisbane's Victoria Bridge - A Dicture Essay by Tim

The present Victoria Bridge opened in 1969 is now closed to all but pedestrians, buses and bicycles from 8:00pm on Sunday the 24th of January.

The BCC has said Victoria Bridge would be converted into three bus lanes and one lane will become a two-way bike lane, which could also be used by electric scooters.


Rebuilt and washed away by floods, the Victoria Bridge was a vital link between the CBD and the busy

southside of the Brisbane River as the following photos show.

From the John Oxley Library comes our first shot taken in 1890 of a horse tram pulled up next to the last wooden bridge, which washed away in the catastrophic 1893 floods and rebuilt in 1897 as the sandstone and steel truss version seen in the remaining photos.





Here at left Brisbane is out to farewell the Queensland Military Contingent in 1914. Photo Courtesy of the John Oxley Library, SLQ image APE-039-01-0008. The tram is a "Dreadnought"



Also from the John Oxley Library we have a shot taken in the mid to late 1930s with a c1936 Hudson Terraplane taxi and a gaggle of vintage trams including a "Toast Rack" followed by a rebuilt Dreadnought with enclosed cab and sides. Interesting the sign for Plume Petrol, was it use at the same time as the Pauls Ice sign below? The cars seem to all be late 1930s American designs

Looking north into the CBD (I think?) across the Victoria Bridge (around 1940?) we see 4 types of transport. It also seems the painters are at work on the LH truss of the





And Finally from the Qld. State archives we see the original 1897 Bridge being dismantled next to the new 1969 Bridge. The far tower of the old Bridge seen on the left of the far side of the Brisbane River still remains and there is a memorial plaque on it for a young lad who was killed in an accident there while taking part in the celebrations for the end of the First World War. Also preserved is a section of tram track..

WITH DUNCAN IN THE ANTARCTIC - Part Two

A day in the life of a plumber at Casey Station

There are no scientists here this year due to COVID which means we are providing minimal opportunity to provide the science support the trades normally provide. We do go out onto the ice and measure the ice thickness at specified locations which gives an opportunity to get off station, ride quads on ice and as the season changes we get to witness the return of the wild life to start the next lap of the breeding cycles. Weekends give the opportunity to head out to one of four remote huts for a change of scenery and the opportunity to go for a wander and explore the terrain. We have to carry a survival pack (15-20kgs) whenever we go off walking so it is a fair work out.



The remnants of Wilkes Station. Abandoned due to the amount of snow build up that occurs. A lot of clean up still to happen. It is a good 60 years since it was in use, being opened in 1957 by the USA and handed to Australia in 1959, it has been abandoned since 1969 due to deterioration of the wooden buildings and fuel contamination.

We did a trip across the ice dragging sleds. This one is an older timber one with leather bindings on the joints.

The sunlight reflected on either side of the sun is referred to as sun dogs

(The sun dog is a member of the family of halos caused by the refraction of sunlight by ice crystals in the atmosphere. Sun dogs typically appear as a pair of subtly coloured patches of light, around 22° to the left and right of the Sun, and at the same altitude above the horizon as the Sun. They can be seen anywhere in the world during any season, but are not always obvious or bright. Sun dogs are best seen and most conspicuous when the Sun is near the horizon.)








Weddell seals are large placid sedentary animals. Both adult males and females are about 3 metres long and weigh around 400–500kg. Alongside two male Sea Lions have a Stand off!! Some species can weigh up to 1,000 kg (2,200 lb) and grow to a length of 3.0 m (10 ft). They can be found in Australia and New Zealand.










Photos from the Archives - Austin Rail inspection Cars





I was sent this photo on the left, and I went looking thru my library and have found a photo of the same vehicle in the book, "The Immortal Austin 7" and found this information. A normal c1927 Austin 7 Chummy Tourer, was converted to run on railway track by D.Wickham of Ware, 24 miles north of London, in Hertfordshire. The wheels fitted are solid cast iron, and the constant hammering driving on solid rails put a lot of strain on the Austin's skinny hubs and wheel bearings. The steering wheel was also removed, making for an unnerving experience for the driver who was used to being in control of his steering! The heavy bumpers would have been useful on wet rails when the little 7" diameter x 1" wide cable brakes would have quite a job! This was a very short lived experiment Later versions were a proper designed rail car using commercially available Austin engines designed for boats and other applications.

The other vehicle is a much more unusual 1938-40 American Bantam Pick-up. This is the car that is the missing link between our little British Austin and the All-American Jeep. The Bantam is developed from the American Austin of 1930-31 which was a licence built version of the Austin Seven, and the American Bantam Company developed the first prototype for the GP (Jeep) reconnaissance vehicle!
